#### From our Pastor's Heart ..



Dear Friends.

In November of 2017, I brought to the Session the idea of entertaining a Clergy/Congregational renewal program at FPC. I knew there was a grant offered for this type of program through the Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Program at Christian Theological Seminary.

Carol Evans and I made a visit to Camp Kirkmont to explore the facilities for an upcoming women's retreat. There we met the camp's director, Buzz Reed. In conversation the topic of the Lilly Grant came up and Buzz told us that he had assisted at least 9 congregations in completing grants for the Renewal Program and would be happy to help FPC.

With the support of Session I pulled together a group of people to explore the possibility of obtaining a grant for FPC. The initial group was Carol Evans, Lynn Burke, Mike England, Kent King, Karen McNeal, Nikki Hogarth and myself. We began meeting weekly in January knowing that the deadline was April 13, 2018. Mike and Kent later stepped down because their schedules were too full and Alison Miller joined us. Both Kent and Mike remain interested in the process and available to answer congregational questions. Kent has offered to edit the grant and make sure we are following all the guidelines.

The grant is close to submission. We will not hear about whether we have been awarded it until late August this year. I understand that they award about 100 grants a year. There has been a bit of confusion about the timing. The Renewal (which is "kind of" like a short sabbatical) will be from **April 30, 2019-August 10, 2019.** We are required to submit the grant the year before the renewal will take place.

The grant work is very extensive. They want a lot of detail about the congregation, about me and about our ministry. We must account for all the money we are requesting. The grant we are applying for is \$50,000 with up to \$15,000 available for the congregation, its pastoral care/preaching and its renewal programming.

The Session and this renewal committee are pretty excited about this opportunity. They want 2019 to be a year of renewal for FPC. How that takes shape for the congregation has been sketched out, but is not in stone. Once the grant is submitted, we would like to get input from the congregation. What might interest you? How might you see the congregation using this time while I'm away? If you are interested in participating in this please let me know. We want your input.

As I have said above, we won't know whether we will receive the grant until late August. If we do not get it, both plans for the congregation and me will be adjusted and reshaped. We are hoping though that we will be successful.

I see this time for me as an opportunity to step back, to explore creativity and spiritual formation, to practice slowing down, (which is hard for me) and a time to renew acquaintances with people who have been pivotal on my journey of life and faith. I'm pretty excited about it. I think it will also be a time for all of us to fill our cups with fresh new energy and insight.

Unless God has other plans, I expect to be with you until I retire. I think this opportunity will prepare us for the next step of our ministry together. May God continue to bless us as we make our way to Easter.

### New Adult Study Begins April 9th & 11th



When we think of a detective story, we often think of murder mysteries. The Bible contains some detective stories, which could also be called "life mysteries." These stories are not all mystery stories in the conventional sense of the word, but they investigate incidents, personalities, and topics that ought to catch

the interest of anyone with a detective's turn of mind.

For example, the Bible has a lot to say about blood. Why is this so important, and how far back, biblically, does this theme go? In another example, our environmentally-conscious twenty-first century warns that we humans may destroy our planet. Did the writer of Genesis have a head start on this idea when Cain was warned that the ground would no longer yield for him because he had killed his brother?

We will investigate these and several other life mysteries in the book "Detective Stories from the Bible", by J. Ellsworth Kalas. Chapters include: "A Biography of Satan"; "Follow the Blood"; "Job Tells His Story"; and "The Advantage of Fourth Place".

Classes will begin the week after Easter, with the first class sessions on Monday, April 9th at 7 p.m. and on Wednesday, April 11th at 9:30 a.m. Both classes meet in the church library. All adults are welcome to attend. Materials are free of charge and will be read during class. The first half of this study will last six weeks. We will break for the summer and resume the study of the book's last six chapters in the fall.
