From our Pastor's Heart ...

Dear Friends,

I hope that your summer has brought you rest and refreshment! In April, we submitted a proposal for a congregation/pastor renewal grant sponsored by the Lilly Endowment. We received a letter last week that informed us that we didn't get the grant. I was really disappointed because the renewal committee put in so many hours preparing the document and those who reviewed it and had grant writing experience thought we had nailed it.

That said, we are still planning on a year of renewal for the congregation and myself. The Session has committed funds to continue to move forward with 5 educational opportunities that will be led by Rev. Dr. Eric Law and Associates from the Kaleidoscope Institute. Nikki Hogarth met Dr. Eric Law when she attended one of his conferences at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary a couple of years ago. She has shared with me how much his teachings have impacted her ministry here at FPC.

The Mission of the Kaleidoscope Institute is: *"To provide resources to equip church leaders to create sustainable churches and communities."* Your leaders, including myself, have continued to be forward thinking. How do we best use our resources of staff, people and dollars? How can we best serve our community and still care for our members while growing in our faith and love for our God? It's easy to focus on one of those topics, but we are called to balance all three remaining always open to the movement of the Holy Spirit.

I found a YouTube video that Rev. Dr. Eric Law made for conference attendants prior to one of his seminars on Holy Currency. If you want to have a better idea of what his research focuses on take time to watch this three-minute video. (https://youtu.be/13lADNde9I0). Then if you have more questions ask me, Nikki or other members of the Renewal Committee (Lynn Burke, Carol Evans, Alison Miller, or Karen McNeal. Mike England and Kent King helped in the beginning of the process and can answer some questions as well.) Know that there will be more information forthcoming as 2019 is just around the corner.

As for my time of renewal, it will be the same in length, three months. Much of what Brian and I planned for our time away was contingent on the grant coming through. Our next step is to evaluate how we are to spend this time away. We will be putting our heads together for our part and the Renewal Committee will continue to meet to finalize congregational details. If you would like to be a part of the planning, just let me or Lynn Burke know.


INTRODUCING NEW FACES AROUND FPC

ON THE FABULOUS KLAIS ORGAN IN GRAY CHAPEL




