Dear Friends.

As we continue our journey of Lent I want to share with you a writing by Donald K. McKim from his book Living into Lent.

McKim writes:

"Our Lenten journey is a constant process of looking to what we are "becoming" in Jesus Christ. As Christ's disciples, we always seek his will. For our own lives, we want to know what person Christ wants us to be. This involves listening to God's Spirit, seeking Christ's ways, and looking to the larger purposes of God for us."

"We are part of this process of "becoming" because we have turned away from living life on our own. We have said, "No" to ourselves and our desires for how to live and what to seek. We have said, "Yes" to Christ's call to follow him. This is the contrast of what the New Testament refers to as "flesh" and "spirit." Flesh means what we want; spirit is what God wants from us."

"Amy Plantinga Pauw puts this clearly for us when she notes that Lent means affirming that our life "according to the flesh is dead." We do not give in to our selfish urges. Lent is a time to affirm that "new life and peace" can be and is ours through the Spirit of Christ. The possibilities of becoming who Christ wants us to be, to live in fullness, or "eternal" life, to be at peace with God and with others -- all this and more are possible through the Spirit of Christ."

This Lent can you lean into this new life and peace offered by a life in Christ? What will it take for you to be liberated from a life in the flesh so that you can embrace more fully a life in Christ? How might you describe your life in Christ to someone else?

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ continue to walk with you as you make your way to Jerusalem.

MAUNDY THURSDAY WORSHIP & SEDER MEAL

April 18th - 6:00pm in the Social Room

The Passover (Seder), the most ancient of all Jewish festivals, commemorates the formation of the people of God out of a mass of slaves, the very beginning of our Judeo-Christian heritage. It is a joyful but serious religious service. When the angel of death passed over the Israelites homes which were marked with the blood of a lamb they were able to escape bondage in Egypt (hence, Passover).

Since that time a "talk feast" has been observed telling the story of God's providential act, teaching especially the children the significance of the exodus. Observed as a command of God, the meal is a memorial to freedom, the events of deliverance being relived sacramentally: unleavened bread (hasty exit before the bread could rise), bitter herbs (bitter experience in Egypt), fruit and wine (mixture representing bricks made as slaves).

In observing the Passover, we identify ourselves with the children of Israel in Egypt, and their exodus becomes real to us. We conclude our meal with the celebration of Christian Communion as a New Testament congregation.

We will gather in the Social Room at 6pm for a full meal of the symbolic sacrificial lamb served along with the traditional storytelling and partaking of symbolic elements. **Reservations are requested** so that we may be adequately prepared to serve everyone. Please call church office or note on pew pad the number of people attending.
