

As we begin a gradual transition back to a more nearly normal Sunday service, I would like to offer heartfelt thanks to the Covid Choir on behalf of the congregation. Members of the chancel choir have sung as the "Covid Choir" for more than a year. They

adapted to many limitations that would enable them to sing as safely as possible.

The size of each Sunday's group was limited to single digits, so not all of the singers could participate every week. They followed a flexible schedule that sometimes required last-minute changes. All singers wore masks, no small impediment to good vocal sound and clear diction. They sat at least six feet apart, especially challenging for choral singers who strive to blend seamlessly as a group. And they had to review the hymns and service music, as well as learn an anthem, within less than an hour's rehearsal prior to the service. They had to forgo the usual mid-week rehearsal, the opportunity for intense work on the music and the disciplined repetition that is essential for a satisfying performance.

Many of the anthems were new to most of the singers, because much of the music in the choir library is intended for a larger group, and even those anthems that the choir had sung before often had to be rearranged to be suitable for the limited number of voices.

Invariably the singers rose to the challenge. With commitment, hard work, gracious cooperation, and prayer, their singing helped ensure that each streamed service was dedicated to the glory of God, a worshipful celebration of the faithful Christian community embodied in First Presbyterian Church.


